What happened to the 'solar bridge' policy?

In addition, the administration has announced the end of the temporary 'solar bridge' policy, which facilitated duty-free imports from Cambodia, Malaysia, Thailand and Vietnam. This measure, initially intended to support the ramp-up of domestic solar manufacturing, concluded on June 6.

How will Section 201 affect the US solar industry?

To support continued growth in U.S. solar manufacturing, the administration will manage the current 5-gigawatt tariff-rate quota for imported solar cells under Section 201. Should imports approach this quota, it will be raised by an additional 7.5 gigawatts to ensure a steady supply for domestic module manufacturing.

Do solar panels have to be certified by Customs & Border Protection?

U.S. Customs and Border Protection will rigorously monitor compliance, necessitating detailed certifications from importers. Earlier in 2024, CBP began issuing questionnaires to solar companies requesting extensive disclosures about the source of modules, panels and other products.

Will bifacial solar panels be removed from safeguard tariffs?

A notable pivot in policy is the imminent removal of the bifacial module exclusion under Section 201. Bifacial solar panels, which are predominantly used in utility-scale projects, have enjoyed an exclusion from safeguard tariffs.
