Locker rooms must be accessible to all. Everyone, no matter their abilities, should feel welcome. It's not just good practice; it's the law (ADA in the US).

Partitions and doors should be designed to ensure people using accessible dressing and fitting rooms privacy equivalent to that afforded other users of the facility.

Accessible lockers should position handles between 750mm and 1200mm from floor level. Additionally, at least 5% of total lockers must meet accessibility standards.

You will need to allow for the following for minimum aisle widths: For a single row of lockers aisles should be 900mm or more For opposing rows of lockers aisles should be 1200mm or ...

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
